- **8.1. Choice Based Credit System:** M.A. (Hons.) English is based upon the Choice based Credit System chosen by Akal University.

- **Skill Enhancement Course SEC:** These courses are offered to the students in order to enhance their skills in different domains of the field. These courses help the students to get research skills, a necessity in the academia.

9. Teaching Learning Process

The process of teaching and learning includes the following methods

- Lectures: The courses of the entire program are shared with the students in an interesting and detailed manner through the classroom lecture method. This helps the student to get a comprehensive knowledge of the related subject along with addressing their doubts.
- **Tutorial:** Tutorials provide opportunities for closer interaction between students and teachers, which takes into account the individual needs of each student.
- **Mentoring:** Mentoring is an important part of the teaching and learning process in this programme as the teacher strives to understand each student's progress and his or her individual problems and addresses them.
- Assignments and Projects: Assignments and projects are also given to the students in the process of teaching and learning in this program.
- **Practical**: Some courses have a practical section under which students will do practical in the lab or classroom as demanded in the syllabus.
- Monday Test: Assessment includes Monday Tests for the continuity of students' learning process, which will help in identifying the strengths and weaknesses of the learning-teaching process and making necessary improvements during the semester. It is through this process that the difficult and easy parts of the concepts being taught, as well as the bright and weak students are continuously identified.
- Remedial Classes: This ensures that weaker students are not left behind in the learning process.

10. Assessment Method & Instructions for Paper Setter:

From the point of view of evaluator, the assessment of the course is divided into three parts.

- Internal Assessment (20 Marks): Internal Assessment is made by the subject tutor based on the performance and participation of student in Monday test, attendance and daily learning behavior in the classroom. It could also include quizzes and assignments for some or all courses as per requirement of the student's learning level.
- MCQs or Multiple-Choice Questions: Each student has to attend an MCQ test, which will be taken at the end of the semester. The student has to answer 20 questions in total. 1 mark will be awarded for each correct answer and 0.25 marks will be deducted for each wrong answer. No marks will be awarded/deducted for questions not attempted.
- Theory Examination: Student has to write a theory paper with a total duration of three hours. It will have 60 marks. The question paper will be divided into 5 parts. In the first part of the question paper, 6 questions with short answers will be asked from all the parts of the syllabus with the same representation. All the questions are compulsory in this section, each question carries 2 marks $(2 \times 6 = 12)$. The remaining 4 sections will have 2 questions from each section of the syllabus, out of which one has to be answered. Each question carries 12 marks $(12 \times 4 = 48)$.
