The sea is never still. It bears within it the whispers of history, the thunder of storms, and hushed melodies of societies that live along its shore. For South Asia, the sea has always been other than geography: a grand chronicler inscribing epics of trade and migration, exile and settlement, loss and resurrection. However, in the Anthropocene era, this chronicler speaks in a vocabulary of rising tides, eroded coastlines, and disrupted lives. Its waters pound against our shores not only as natural cycles but as messages, urgent and relentless.

This is the paradox we'd like to ponder: sea as a cultural storehouse of memory, and bearer of crisis. With the South Asian Anthropocene, coastal living is disrupted—the coastlines submerge, cyclones wipe out fisher people's songs, and old ways disappear in development. But out of this turmoil, a resilience emerges: campaigns against power, indigenous knowledge, reimagination in poetry, and artworks that reassert a horizon of survival for the sea. This event listens to the sea both as a witness and a speaker, and invites researchers, authors, policy-makers, and activists to join in thinking about how South Asia will negotiate its entangled waters between cultural crisis and environmental protest. This conference, by encompassing the South Asian oceanic entanglements and the indomitable natural challenges, aims to redefine the most possible and practical ways of hindering the decay of eco-biological marine life diversity, as well as to utilise the natural resources in such a way as to maximise the sustainability and livelihood for future generations, and marine species.

Objectives

- To reframe the ocean as a cultural and ecological interlocutor in the Anthropocene.
- To delve into how crisis, protest, and memory intersect in coastal South Asia.
- To draw upon literature, oral history and arts as a stock of
- To enhance inter-disciplinary exchanges between policy, humanities & social sciences.
- To produce knowledge for sustainable governance emanating from cultural contexts.

Relevance

In bringing cultural imagination and policy imperative together, this conference directly engages ICSSR's mandate. Displacement, livelihood insecurity, inequality, and governance—the very concerns at the core of India's and South Asia's socio-political dilemma—are dealt with. It does this while placing these within a literary and cultural perspective, enriching scholarship while providing routes to actionable policy.
